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PURPOSE OF AGKSOM, GETTING STARTED, WEEKEND AT A GLANCE

PURPOSE OF AGKSOM

AGKSOM exists to provide training for those sensing a call to ministry, whether as credentialed ministers of the Assemblies of God, or as equipped local church volunteers. AGKSOM integrates spiritual formation, relational networking, academic achievement, and practical ministry application to provide a unique learning experience. Students not only acquire knowledge necessary for obtaining ministerial credentials, but also develop character and skills essential for effective ministry.

GETTING STARTED

- Students must be at least 16 years old or a Junior in High School to attend AGKSOM.
- Registration and payment for classes is completed online at www.agkansas.com/agksom. Registration
 closes four weeks before the scheduled class date. We recommend registering as early as possible to
 allow enough time for completing required reading and assignments prior to class.
- Once registration and payment are complete, the course syllabus and study guide will be emailed to each student.
- Students are responsible to purchase their own textbooks. ISBN and GPH numbers for the correct edition
 of each text are listed with the course descriptions in the AGKSOM Catalog and in the class syllabus
 emailed to each student following his or her registration.
- Students must read textbooks and complete study guides (approximately 10 hours of pre-course study) and arrive at class with a basic knowledge and understanding of the information covered.
- Students are responsible for their lodging and meals during an AGKSOM class weekend.
- Students are expected to arrive at class early, with a printed copy of all pre-class assignments completed and ready for submission, prepared to fully participate in the classroom experience.

Credentials-seeking students may submit a transcript from Berean/Global University or any other Bible-training institution to the AGK office and request an evaluation of what AGKSOM classes may or may not be required in order to meet credentialing educational requirements.

WEEKEND AT A GLANCE

During a typical AGKSOM weekend you will arrive BEFORE 6:00 PM on Friday to turn in your typed, printed study guide and prepare for class. Orientation and classes begin at 6:00 PM and go until 9:30 PM. Study guides must be submitted before orientation begins. Saturday sessions are scheduled from 9:00 – 11:00 AM, with tests given from 11:00 AM until noon. Grading for each course will be determined by averaging test and study guide scores.

You will need to arrive Friday evening with all reading and study guides completed (approximately ten hours of pre-class work), prepared to participate in classroom lecture and discussion. Classroom instruction provides an overview of the course material, practical application, and opportunity for questions and discussion. During classroom instruction, instructors share personal experience and use a variety of teaching methods.

GRADING & TEXTBOOKS, REGISTRATION & ATTENDANCE POLICIES, STUDENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

GRADING AND TEXTBOOKS

Purchasing textbooks, securing lodging, and all meals are the responsibility of the student. Students are encouraged to order textbooks as early as possible from a store of their choosing. For your convenience, the AGKSOM webpage features a bookstore link. The link, the online course description, and the information in your registration email all include the ISBN for the correct edition of any required text..

Grading is based on a standard percentage scale (A=90-100%, B=80-89%, C=70-79%, etc.). The final grade will be the average of the student's study guide (pre-class work) and the final exam. In order to receive credit for a course, students must have a final grade of 70% or better.

REGISTRATION & ATTENDANCE POLICIES

Students are required to register and pay for each course no later than four weeks prior to the course date. However, students are strongly encouraged to register as soon as possible to allow enough time to complete the required reading and study guide.

Students must attend the entire class session (Friday and Saturday) to receive credit for the course. Late arrivals may result in a grade deduction. Special allowances may be made ONLY for unforeseen emergencies that occur immediately before or during a course weekend and are given at the discretion of AGKSOM administration. Unforeseen emergencies include but are not limited to: serious injury, death of a family member, or an unforeseen emergency of a church or ministry member that requires your presence in a professional manner. Students must consult with AGKSOM administration or faculty before missing or leaving class. In cases where allowances are made for course absence, students must submit their completed study guide at or before the beginning of the course and complete a make-up assignment relative to the course as determined by the course instructor and/or AGKSOM administration. All make-up assignments must be submitted within one month of the absence or credit for the course will not be given and the student must retake the course either through AGKSOM or Berean School of the Bible. In case of special allowance, course grade will be determined by the average scores of the study guide and make-up assignment. If a student is unable to complete the makeup assignment or is unable to attend a course for allowances mentioned above the student may apply their paid tuition to another course within three months of the original absence. Refunds will not be given.

STUDENT CODE OF ETHICS, CONDUCT, AND HONOR

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a Christ like and biblical manner at all times in both their personal conduct and pursuit of their studies, striving to maintain the highest of ethical standards, including honesty and integrity. Failure to adhere to such standards may result in the student's dismissal from AGKSOM without credit or refund subject to the decision of the school's administration.

Married couples or peers studying together are expected to do their own individual work. Cutting and pasting answers from a study partner is considered cheating. Because of the nature of the courses, using the search feature on an ebook to avoid having to read the text is considered cheating.

In the classroom, students should be respectful of their peers and instructors. Behavior that is disruptive to the learning process and disrespectful to others will not be tolerated and will be addressed, first by the instructor of the class, and, if necessary, by the administration. Students refusing to be cooperative may be dismissed from the school without credit or refund.

Successful completion of this program fulfills the educational requirements for the Certified Minister level of AG credentials. Completion does not guarantee receipt of a ministerial credential.

CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE TRAINING

This program is for students seeking credentials with the Assemblies of God. This certificate is awarded after the successful completion of all Certified Minister and License Training courses (Track One and Two) and the Level One and Two Internships. Successful completion of this program and the Certified Minister Training program fulfills the educational requirements for the License level of AG credentials. Completion does not guarantee receipt of a ministerial credential.

CERTIFICATE OF ORDINATION TRAINING

This program is for students seeking credentials with the Assemblies of God. This certificate is awarded after the successful completion of all Certified Minister, License, and Ordination Training courses (Track One, Two, Three) and the Level One, Two, Three Internships. Successful completion of this program along with the Certified Minister Training and License Training program fulfills the educational requirements for the Ordination level of AG credentials. Completion does not guarantee receipt of a ministerial credential.

CERTIFICATE OF BIBLICAL STUDIES

This program is for students not necessarily seeking credentials with the Assemblies of God, but who want to deepen their understanding of the Bible. This certificate is awarded after the successful completion of all the following courses: Introduction to Pentecostal Doctrine, Romans, Pentateuch, How to Interpret the Bible, Acts, Corinthians, Old Testament Survey, Poetic Books, Life of Christ, and New Testament Survey.

CERTIFICATE OF PRACTICAL MINISTRY

This program is for students involved, or seeking to be involved, in local church ministry, but not necessarily seeking credentials with the Assemblies of God. This certificate is awarded after the successful completion of the following courses: Introduction to Pentecostal Doctrine, Ministerial Ethics, Conflict Management, Multicultural Ministry, Leadership Skills, Spirit Baptism and the Gifts, Spirit-Empowered Church, Prayer and Worship, Evangelism, and Apologetics.

A note concerning scheduling and course descriptions:

The AGKSOM course schedule reflects the progression required to fulfill the educational requirements for AG credentialing. On the schedule, tracks one, two and three are the requirements for Certified Minister, License and Ordained, respectively, and should be completed in sequence. Course descriptions are also listed according to the three certificate programs pertaining to credentials. Because the Certificates of Biblical Studies and Practical Ministry are not progressive in nature, their course schedules are taken from all three tracks. Course requirements for these certificate programs are listed above and the course descriptions will be found in the following lists for the three certificate programs pertaining to credentials.

STUDENT INTERNSHIP

The General Council of the Assemblies of God requires an internship program for each level of ministerial credential (certified, licensed and ordained). The AGKSOM ministerial internship program fulfills this requirement and offers all three levels of internship.

The internship program enables students to confirm God's call, develop Christ-like character, gain the competencies of ethical and effective ministry, and develop the personal disciplines essential to a successful life and ministry. This strategy uses guided "hands-on" ministry experiences, interaction with qualified mentors/coaches, reading, and the exercise of personal spiritual disciplines to accomplish its mission.

To enroll in the internship program students must:

- 1. Complete at least three AGKSOM courses OR three Berean/Global University courses (or their equivalents) at the appropriate level of credential.
- 2. Review the Internship Syllabus provided online to understand the requirements for the desired level of internship.
- 3. Identify and recruit a qualified mentor to oversee the completion of each objective and submit a completed "Internship Mentor Agreement." The Internship Syllabus will list mentor qualifications and provide the necessary agreement forms.
- 4. Register for the course and pay applicable registration fees. Students may need to purchase additional reading material depending on the internship guidelines or as assigned by their mentor. Students will NOT be given credit for any internship work before registration is completed through AGKSOM.
